South Africa's ODI captain has relinquished the gloves, but his batting remains as powerful as ever. His wicket will be massive for the Aussies. Will almost certainly do great things in the field too.

FAF DU PLESSIS

Unstoppable with the bat the last time these two sides met in ODI competition earlier this year, Australia will see his as their most precious wicket. Has been rested for the KFC T20 INTLs leaving him to focus on ODIs.

DALE STEYN
